

Address by Rev. Fr. Hady Mahfouz, President of the Holy Spirit University of Kaslik (USEK)

Closing Ceremony of the University Cooperation for Peace and Development

February 21, 2014

Honorable representatives of ambassadors and university presidents and military authorities, Dear USEK friends and members, dear parents and dear graduates,

It gives me a great pleasure to see you all here today celebrating with us the graduation of the third generation of students in the Master of University Cooperation for Peace and Development.
