#### **Background**

USEK was founded in 1938 as an independent private Catholic institution, by the Lebanese Maronite Order (hereafter referred to as the "OLM") who serves Higher education in monasteries since the 18<sup>th</sup> century. The University was founded before the first Lebanese Law of Higher Education promulgated in 1961, and by that date, the Lebanese State recognized USEK as a private Higher Education Institution in Lebanon, according to the Law of Higher Education in Lebanon. Since 1997, the university has adopted the North American credit system, in order to facilitate students' credit transfer and recognition and to move toward an American Style institution.

#### Mission

Since its founding, USEK seeks, and in accordance with the Article 92 of the Constitutions of the OLM (ed. 2012) and the social teaching of the Catholic Church on universities, to contribute to the development of all its students through quality educational programs and research in various fields of study. By providing a high quality American-style education to its students, USEK intends to prepare future leaders for innovation, professional growth and life-long learning, in Lebanon, within the Middle East and throughout the world. USEK is committed to a faith-based educational development of its students rooted in the Catholic tradition whereby spiritual values and ethics as well as respect for cultural and religious pluralism are promoted.

#### **Institutional Evaluation Program**

In September 2009, USEK has completed an Institutional Evaluation Program conducted by the European Association of Universities (EUA) and became the first university in the Middle East that conducts such an evaluation program.



In December 2012, USEK was granted the European Institutional Accreditation for five years by the German institution, evalag EVALUATIONSAGENTUR BADEN – WÜRTTEMBERG, EQAR (European Quality Assurance Register), ENQA (European Association for Quality Assurance in Higher Education) and EUA member.



USEK became the first university in Lebanon and the region to gain accreditation for its student support services, which aims to ensure its commitment to offer high quality services to its students for their welfare on campus, and ultimately for supporting them in their learning, career and life goals.



#### President



Father Professor Georges W. Hobeika, member of the Lebanese Maronite Order, became the President of the Holy Spirit University of Kaslik (USEK) in September 2016.

Father Professor Hobeika has held several leading academic and administrative positions. At the Holy Spirit University of Kaslik, he served as Dean of the Faculty of Philosophy and Humanities from 1992 till 2001. Between 2001 and 2010, he served as the Vice-President for Research and Francophone Affairs, the President of the Higher Research Centre as well as the President of the Doctoral College. As President of the USEK Construction Commission for 4 years (2002-2006), he oversaw all the site constructions and renovations held at the University. In 2010,

Father Professor Hobeika was appointed as Vice-President for International Affairs, and later in 2013 as the Deputy-President for Francophone International Affairs.

In 2011, Father Professor Hobeika received the award of the Insignia of Officer from the Order of Academic Palms by the French Government for his major academic contributions.

On the national level, from 2002 to date, Father Professor Hobeika has been serving as a member of the Equivalence Committee at the Lebanese Ministry of Education and Higher Education.

On the international level, he is member of the Board of Directors of ACISE (International Catholic Association of Institutions of Education Sciences, and the Sectorial Group of the International Federation of Catholic Universities - IFCU), and a Member of the Board of Unimed (Union of Mediterranean Universities). He has contributed in several areas of studies and has lectured in philosophy, politics, education, ethics, religion, socio-economics. He is also a Visiting Professor and Lecturer in numerous countries including France, Italy, Germany, Poland, Chile, Argentina and Australia. He is fluent in four languages: Arabic, French, English and German.

Father Professor Hobeika was born in Meedane in the district of Jezzine in South Lebanon, but he also has French citizenship. He received his Ph.D. degree in German Philosophy with highest distinction from Paris-Sorbonne University in 1992. He took his first degree in Theology from the Holy Spirit University of Kaslik (USEK) in 1983. He is the author of several widely published books and articles.






# Distribution of Full-time Faculty Members by Degree


# Distribution of Full-time Faculty Members by Rank




Full-time Faculty Members Age Distribution



### Fall 2015-2016


➤ Did the students demonstrate achievement of the desired educational outcomes that you, as instructor, hoped to cover?

# Average of answers 3.4/4


➤ How do you compare the overall students' performance relatively with previous terms?




