<b>Subject's national or worldwide context, objectives &amp; research lines</b>	
<p>The field of language acquisition has always been a controversial topic due to the emergence of multiple theories. The study should be empirical in nature and multiple collection methods are to be used to attain triangulation to assure the reliability, validity, and credibility of data, which will be analyzed quantitatively and qualitatively. Conclusions, recommendations, and suggestions are to be made in the final part for further future studies and research on the subject.</p>
