
Explore our destinations, connected by a shared vision!

8.1 Financial Aid Office Support

USEK's Financial Aid Office is committed to supporting your child's academic goals by providing various forms of financial support. Our team of experienced professionals is ready to assist students in navigating the financial aid application process and exploring various sources of funding.

We strive to make education accessible to all students, regardless of their financial circumstances, and are committed to promoting equity and inclusivity. Our goal is to empower our students to achieve academic success and reach their full potential.

8.2 Understanding Fees: A Guide to Tuition and NSSF Membership

At USEK, we are dedicated to ensuring that your child's transition to our university is as smooth as possible. We believe that excellent education begins with an efficient registration system, and our process is designed specifically to simplify their experience. *For more information, please click <u>here</u> (section C).*

Our team will guide them through each stage, reflecting our goal to provide exceptional value in education. For detailed information on our affordable tuition fees, please click <u>here</u> (section D).

As part of the enrollment process, students will be affiliated with the National Social Security Fund (NSSF), a mandatory requirement that grants access to health and social security benefits. This affiliation adds an important layer of support during their time at USEK and **complies with NSSF regulations applicable across all institutions in Lebanon**.

Students who are already affiliated with the NSSF or an equivalent fund (such as Cooperatives, military, judges and lawyers, Lebanese University, municipalities) must submit an official document at the NSSF Delegate Office.

Students not currently affiliated with the NSSF are required to complete an exemption form at the NSSF Delegate Office and will incur a membership fee of 60 USD.

In both cases, this process must be completed before the scheduled deadline (refer to the Academic Calendar). Students who miss this deadline and **do not complete the required forms** will forfeit USEK NSSF coverage, and the fees will be automatically credited to their account upon the second payment of tuition fees (60 USD per academic year).

Our commitment to creating a supportive environment extends beyond the registration process to assist in pursuing academic goals. To gain a comprehensive understanding, we recommend checking <u>the Academic Rules and Student Life</u> <u>guide</u>. This resource provides detailed insights into academic guidelines and the support services available at USEK.

8.3 Understanding Payment Procedures

At USEK, we understand that managing finances is a crucial part of the student's learning journey. We have designed the *payment procedure* to be student-friendly and to ensure they do not hinder academic progress.

To help you understand the payment process, **here is an example for a Business Undergraduate Student's payment for one semester:**

The student is enrolled in 15 credits* (12 credits major courses and 3 credits general education course [English Communication]) during the Fall Semester and benefits from a 20% Financial Aid and is already affiliated with the NSSF.

12 x 350 USD = 4,200 USD 3 x 220 USD = 660 USD + 200 USD Registration fees + 300 USD Operational fees = 5,360 USD - 30% discount** - 20% Financial Aid = 3,001.6 USD Final fees

*The cost of a credit is determined by the School/Faculty offering the course, not the School/Faculty to which the student is affiliated.

**For the Fall Semester 2024-2025, students will pay 70% of tuition fees in fresh USD, while the remaining 30% will be waived, except for dual degree programs and international students, who are required to pay the full tuition fees.

The above payment is divided into four installments during the semester (dates specified on Academic Calendar):

• **The first payment** is USD 1000 (which includes USD 200 registration fees) and should be settled by the date specified in the Academic Calendar. Failure to make this payment will result in dropping the student's registered courses.

• **The remaining three installments** are scheduled as outlined in the Academic Calendar. Failure to make any of the payments leads to a financial penalty calculated based on the overdue amount.



10. Campus Facilities

As of August 2022, we have made significant enhancements to ensure that all campus areas fully comply with accessibility requirements. This important improvement creates a more inclusive and accommodating environment for all students. The following sections will also highlight additional facilities available for students, including sports facilities on the Kaslik campus, to meet standards and ambitions.

10.1 University Library

The USEK Library offers outstanding resources and services. With two reading rooms and study spaces equipped with modern tools and digital resources, the library operates 40 hours per week. Its collections are continuously updated based on student usage patterns. It is fully automated, providing remote access to a wide range of digital resources and reference services. Since 2006, we have proudly established centers dedicated to the preservation of Lebanese cultural heritage, allowing researchers seamless access to invaluable archives.

10.2 University Restaurant

The University Restaurant is a vibrant and welcoming dining establishment on campus, catering to the diverse tastes of students, faculty, and staff. Designed to provide a comfortable atmosphere, it serves as a hub for socializing, nourishment, and relaxation.

The Restaurant offers a mix of self-service options for quick meals, ideal for those with tight schedules between classes or meetings, as well as a sit-down area for a more relaxed dining experience. It emphasizes the use of fresh, seasonal ingredients and promotes healthy and sustainable food practices.

10.3 University Residence

Inaugurated in November 2007 and managed by the SAO, the University Residence provides self-catering accommodation in single, double, triple, or triple/single rooms that are modern, affordable, comfortable, and spacious. With various private and common areas for studying, relaxing and socializing, it offers a home away from home during your child's time at USEK.

The Residence is located on the north-eastern side of campus, near the University Restaurant, behind Building E and adjacent to our trademark green spaces.

Accommodating up to 168 students across six floors, the Residence includes a shared kitchen on each floor. It is open from 7:00 a.m. to 1:00 a.m. Monday through Thursday, and from 7:00 a.m. to 2:00 a.m. Fridays and Saturdays. A University Residence Curfew Agreement must be signed by all parents and guardians before any student can move into the Residence. The University Residence is open to female students actively pursuing a degree at USEK.

To reserve a room, please email <u>residence@usek.edu.lb</u> at least two months before the expected arrival of the student. Priority will be given to students with the longest commutes to the University, while the remaining rooms are allocated on a first-come, first-served basis.

The Campus Safety and Security Office plays a crucial role in ensuring the wellbeing and protection of students, faculty, staff, and visitors on the University premises. It is responsible for creating and maintaining a safe and secure campus environment. This office collaborates with local law enforcement agencies, implements security measures, and develops comprehensive safety protocols to mitigate potential risks and respond effectively to emergencies.

Adopting an initiative-taking approach, the Campus Safety and Security Office monitors surveillance systems and maintains a visible presence on campus. Its team enforces campus policies and regulations, ensuring compliance while promoting a respectful and inclusive atmosphere. The office also manages crowd control, enforces access control measures, responds to emergencies and monitors the event area for any security concerns during on-campus events. Its primary goal is to ensure the safety and well-being of all attendees.

Additionally, we offer on-campus nursing services for emergencies and immediate first aid support, ensuring assistance is available before considering external resources such as the Red Cross.






