



## Terms and Conditions for the Talent's Program Scholarship

The Holy Spirit University of Kaslik (USEK), honoring its vision to empower and support its students, launched its new Scholarship for students showcasing their talent on campus and in events. Whether students are part of the School of Music and Performing arts or any other School/Faculty, they are entitled to the "Talents Program Scholarship".

### Scholarship terms and conditions:

- The Scholarship percentages vary from 5% to 25%, depending on the student's talent, engagement and commitment to the work organized within the framework of events organized at the University.
- The Scholarship covers the fees of undergraduate programs and for the primary program only.
- The Talent Program Scholarship does not cover the summer session, UCLC courses and continuing education.
- The Talent Program Scholarship does not cover the registration and NSSF fees.
- The scholarship holder should undertake a full-time schedule (a minimum of 12 credits and a maximum of 18 credits for undergraduate studies).
- The maintaining of the scholarship is subject to the talent program's supervisor recommendations, the candidate's academic situation, and the assessment of the director of SAO. (to be reviewed on and renewed on a semester basis)
- The Scholarship is not subject to any cumulating of discounts unless it is a sibling's discount or merit scholarship.
- The maintaining of the scholarship is subject to the student's engagement and commitment to Rehearsals and events participation.
- If the student fails to show commitment, he/she shall sign a first warning after which he/she shall be suspended from the program.
- Maintaining the Talent Scholarship is conditioned by an audit carried out at the end of each term (done by the SAO). The beneficiary of a scholarship will forfeit his/her scholarship privileges in the following cases:
  - If the student is placed on academic probation (student's cumulative GPA falls below 70/100)
  - If the student fails one or more courses.
  - If the student proceeds with a term withdrawal (he/she will forfeit the scholarship privileges for the interrupted term; and can regain it if he/she rejoins the program).
  - If the student does not show his/her ultimate commitment (rehearsals, events, etc.)
  - Upon decision of the Disciplinary Board, if the student does not sustain an exemplary behavior.
