

## Address of Father Hady Mahfouz President of the Holy Spirit University of Kaslik USEK Internationalization Forum November 17, 2015

<u>Always further</u>: the title chosen for our gathering today is simply great. It implies hope and brings happiness. And going further is about building global education bridges. So our internationalization forum is about developing, and about building, continuously.

We develop our international dimension so our local life would be built in a positive way. And we build our local environment having in mind that a good local context contributes to the development of the international world. We therefore highlight the concept of "glocalization". It is about having care for our common home, as it is nicely stated in the title of the recent encyclical of the Holy Father Pope Francis reflecting on the environmental issue.

Let me especially mention all what is related to quality assurance, where the international practices brought nice things to our local functioning. This can be done in loving every human being, without any discrimination, and all the human being, in all his/her dimensions.

Going always further is to look ahead from where one stands. It is about foreseeing, farseeing, planning and taking action. At USEK, the IASC, which stands for International Affairs Steering Committee, examines our international strategy and action. I would also like to thank Dr. Rima Mattar, Director of the International Affairs Office, not only for being member of the IASC but also for initiating many positive actions in the International Affairs at USEK. She was behind the idea of organizing this forum and she proposed that USEK be the first university from outside Americas to partake in the Internationalization laboratory in the ACE, the American Council on Education. And so it was. A task force from different units at USEK was consequently created and trained in the USA thanks to a State department grant. The efficient action of its members and of all Deans and Directors is highly perceived in our daily life and our programs. So many thanks for every one of them. Heartfelt thanks also to all the team of our International Affairs Office.

In a special note, I would share with you that one of our main concerns at USEK is to nurture the spirit of our students with internationalization through a global culture and through student and faculty mobility.
